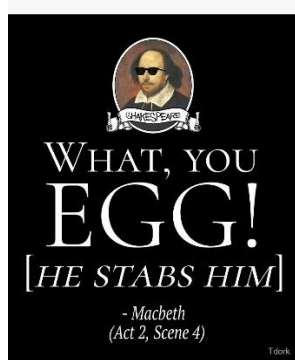
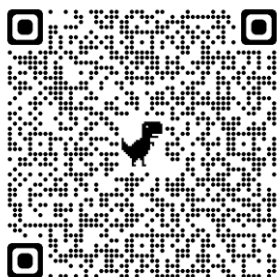


English Revision Guide

- Complete past papers from the website below and self-mark them. Ask your teachers to help!



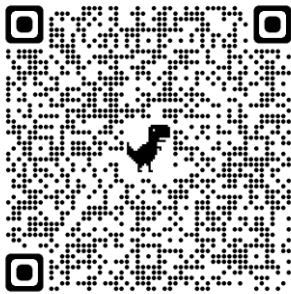
- Watch some videos online (follow the QR code below) and **make notes** about what the videos recommend and try it!



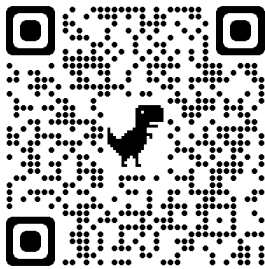
