To be willing to cover other swimming teachers' lessons in case of staff absence or illness.
To plan and deliver swimming lessons for Sidcot Swim School.
To assist and lead Sidcot Swim Academy & Club sessions.
To assist and lead Intensive Swimming Lessons and Swim School assessments during the school holidays.
To communicate effectively with the Sports Centre Manager and with the Swim School Coordinator.
