Main duties and responsibilities:	• To wear the issued Sidcot Swim Teacher uniform and staff ID badge on shifts and to be responsible for keeping it clean and presentable.		
	• To supervise all swimmers and not allow them to enter the water until it is adequately supervised and safe to do so.		
	• To arrive at least five minutes before your shift so you are in uniform, on poolside with equipment prepared for the start of your lesson.		
	To safely set up and pack away equipment within swim teachers lessons as necessary.		
	To communicate effectively with the Sports Centre Manager and with the Swim School Coordinator.		



	• To be willing to cover other swimming teachers' lessons in case of staff absence or illness.
	To have a flexible approach towards working evenings and weekends.
	To check messages and shifts on Microsoft Teams for any updates or changes to working hours.
	• To report any equipment or building defects to the Supervisor on duty & to follow this up to ensure the Manager is informed.
	• To be able to use booking systems on both computer and tablet & to complete registers and progress reports.
	• When on duty, swim teachers will not use mobile phones, mp3 players, smart watches or any other personal equipment that may distract them from supervising the pool.
	To ensure all equipment is cleaned, dried & put away correctly and the poolside is tidy.
	To enter the Academy & Club into open meets & competitions as necessary and to attend with the swimmers.
Line management duties and responsibilities	To lead assistant coaches/teachers with a plan for Swim Academy & Club.
